Summer Work

Your summer work consists of two parts:

- 1) Continuing the research for your Comparative Study
- 2) Creating new artwork

CREATING NEW ARTWORK:

Create at least <u>one piece that you would want graded as a resolved piece</u> (This will be your first resolved artwork grade of the year.)

**Be sure to document all sketches, experiments with media, and any other preliminary or practice work that can be used for your Process Portfolio.

WHAT TO TURN IN ON GOOGLE CLASSROOM:

- 1) Quality photo of resolved piece
- 2) Written self critique following the format and guidelines we have used all year.

COMPARATIVE STUDY SUMMER ASSIGNMENT:

- 1) Continue to read and find new sources that will be helpful to support your connecting theme.
 - Ultimately, you need at least 5 sources per artwork (that is 15 total)
 - For the summer work, I would like you to read at least 2 more per artwork (6 total)
- 2) Continue your **research journal using the 3-part format** that we started during school
 - Citation, copied source information, explanation in your own words of how you will use this source information
- 3) Be sure you are gathering information that will help you explain the following:
 - 1. The <u>function & purpose</u> of each artwork (see pages 53-57 in your textbook)
 - 2. The <u>cultural context</u> and <u>original audience</u> of each artwork
 - 3. Be able to link these two ideas (see the graphic organizer at the top of page 60 in your textbook)

WHAT TO TURN IN ON GOOGLE CLASSROOM: One running document with notetaking for at least 15 sources; page breaks between each source; include MLA citation and notetaking for the 6 additional sources
